If you are reading this, thank you, you are one of the few who read Gazette articles! We, in the office, have known for some time that the Gazette is not read, at least in its entirety, by many. Some time




Sunday, February 25 – We will have Ripple Sunday School on the fourth Sunday of February instead of the third. We will meet from 9:00 - 10:00.

WHAT SHOULD I GIVE UP FOR LENT? MEAT? SWEETS? CHOCOLATE? ICE CREAM? BEVERAGES ? (Author Unknown)

Many of us try to be more disciplined for Lent and give up something that we really like. That's great! Fasting has always been an important tradition of Lent. This year however, let us also consider other things that we can give up.

Give up complaining – Focus on gratitude

Philippians 2:14-15 – "Do everything without complaining or arguing, so that you may become blameless and pure ..."

1 Thessalonians 5:18 – "*Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Jesus Christ.*"

Give up bitterness – Turn to forgiveness

Ephesians 4:31 – "*Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice.*"

Ephesians 4:32 – "Be kind and compassionate to one another forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."

<u>*Give up worry* – Trust in God</u>

Matthew 6:25 – "*Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life…* who by worrying can add a single hour to his life?"

Matthew 6:33 – "But seek first His Kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well."

Give up discouragement - Be full of hope

Deuteronomy 31:8 – "The Lord himself goes before you and will be with you: he will never leave you or forsake you. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged."

Isaiah 40:31 – "But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint."

Give up hatred - Return good for evil

1 John 2:9 – "Anyone who claims to be in the light but hates his brother is still in the darkness."

Luke 6:27 – "But I tell you who hear me; Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you."

Did You Know? Good Shepherd Supports the Eastridge Food Pantry Year-round!

In the spirit of love, compassion, and community outreach, we collect food and monetary donations for a noble cause. The

Eastridge Food Pantry has been a beacon of hope for many in our community, providing sustenance to those in need and ensuring people do not go to bed hungry.

In these challenging high inflation times, the demand at the Eastridge Food Pantry has grown, and they need non-perishable food items. Our church has for many years been a pillar of support and love for this ministry, in which we exemplify the teachings of Christ by lending help to those in need. GSPC folks regularly donate over 1,000 pounds of food, in some years exceeding 1,500 lbs. GSPC folks also give generously regularly exceeding \$1,000 in donations. GSPC had also lent a hand though volunteer hours.

Why Non-Perishable Items? Non-perishable food items have a longer shelf life, ensuring that the pantry can distribute them over time without the risk of spoilage. Such items can range from canned vegetables, grains, pasta, and rice to canned meats, soups, and more. Staples like flour and sugar can make a significant difference in the lives of families who rely on the food pantry.

Making a Difference, One Can at a Time. Every single donation, no matter how small, contributes to a larger purpose. By donating even a single can of food, you're playing a part in alleviating hunger in our community and showing God's love in a tangible way.
