## **The True Hero of the Titanic Inspirational Christian Story**

John Harper was born to a pair of solid Christian parents on May 29th, 1872. It was on the last Sunday of March 1886 when he was thirteen years old that he received Jesus as the Lord of his life. He never knew what it was to "sow his wild oats." He began to preach about four years later at the ripe old age of 17 years by going down to the streets of his village and pouring out his soul in earnest entreaty for men to be reconciled to God.

As John Harper's life unfolded, one thing was apparent...he was consumed by the word of God. When asked by various ministers what his doctrine consisted of, he was known to reply "The Word of God!" After five or six years of toiling on street corners preaching the gospel and working in the mill during the day, Harper was taken in by Rev. E. A. Carter of Baptist Pioneer Mission in London, England. This set Harper free to devote his whole time of energy to the work so dear to his heart. Soon, John Harper started his own church in September of 1896. (Now known as the Harper Memorial Church). This church which John Harper had started with just 25 members had grown to over 500 members when he left 13 years later. During this time, he had gotten married but was shortly thereafter widowed. However brief the marriage, God did bless John Harper with a beautiful little girl named Nana.

Ironically, John Harper almost drowned several times during his life. When he was two and a half years of age, he almost drowned when he fell into a well but was resuscitated by his mother. At the age of twenty-six, he was swept out to sea by a reverse current and barely survived, and at thirty-two, he faced death on a leaking ship in the Mediterranean. Perhaps, God used these experiences to prepare this servant for what he faced next...

It was the night of April 14, 1912. The RMS Titanic sailed swiftly on the bitterly cold ocean waters heading unknowingly into the pages of history. On board this luxurious ocean liner, there were many rich and famous people. At the time of the ship's launch, it was the world's largest man-made moveable object. At 11:40 p.m. on that fateful night, an iceberg scraped the ship's starboard side, showering the decks with ice and ripping open six watertight compartments. The sea poured in.

On board the ship that night was John Harper and his much-beloved six-year-old daughter Nana. According to documented reports, as soon as it was apparent that the ship was going to sink, John Harper immediately took his daughter to a lifeboat. It is reasonable to assume that this widowed preacher could have easily gotten on board this boat to safety; however, it never seems to have crossed his mind. He bent down and kissed his precious little girl; looking into her eyes he told her that she would see him again someday. The flares going off in the dark sky above reflected the tears on his face as he turned and headed towards the crowd of desperate humanity on the sinking ocean liner. As the rear of the huge ship began to lurch upwards, it was reported that Harper was seen making his way up the deck yelling "Women, children and unsaved into the lifeboats!" It was only minutes later that the Titanic began to rumble deep within. Most people thought it was an explosion; actually, the gargantuan ship was literally breaking in half. At this point, many people jumped off the decks and into the icy, dark waters below. John Harper was one of these people.

That night 1528 people went into the frigid waters. John Harper was seen swimming frantically to people in the water leading them to Jesus before the hypothermia became fatal. Mr. Harper swam up to one young man who had climbed up on a piece of debris. Rev. Harper asked him between breaths, "Are you saved?" The young man replied that he was not.

Harper then tried to lead him to Christ only to have the young man who was near shock, reply no. John Harper then took off his life jacket and threw it to the man and said "Here then, you need this more than I do..." and swam away to other people. A few minutes later Harper swam back to the young man and succeeded in leading him to salvation. Of the 1528 people that went into the water that night, six were rescued by the lifeboats. One of them was this young man on the debris. Four years later, at a survivors meeting, this young man stood up and in tears recounted how John Harper had led him to Christ. Mr. Harper had tried to swim back to help other people, yet because of the intense cold, had grown too weak to swim. His last words before going under in the frigid waters were "Believe on the Name of the Lord Jesus and you will be saved." Does Hollywood remember this man? No. Oh well, no matter. This servant of God did what he had to do. While other people were trying to buy their way onto the lifeboats and selfishly trying to save their own lives, John Harper gave up his life so that others could be saved.

"Greater love hath no man than this, that he lay down his life for his friends..."  
John Harper was truly the hero of the Titanic!

## **GOOD SHEPHERD PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH CAMBERSHIP POLICY**

Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church is committed to promoting deeper faith through participation in Bible camps, spiritual retreats and other activities. To that end, we provide “camperships” to help individuals offset the cost of these events and relieve some of the financial burden of attending to their spiritual health. These funds are made possible through two “Campership” funds at Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church.

### **GSPC YOUTH:**

These camperships are made available through donations/foundation money. These camperships will continue as long as donations/fundraising efforts continue to support this worthwhile cause.

This “campership” is for youth (18 years and under) whose family actively participates in our congregation. Camperships may be used to attend a day/overnight or week Christian based camp. It is highly recommended that this camp be Camp Calvin Crest which we support through our church and which Good Shepherd has partial ownership as a member of Homestead Presbytery.

Camperships will be awarded for 35% of the camp fee not to exceed \$125.00 per child per year.

If attending Camp Calvin Crest, the camp is aware of our policy and no GSPC paperwork needs **to be filled out**. If attending another Christian based camp, please fill out the “GSPC Application For Campership Request Form” located in the church office **PRIOR** to registering for the camp. Camps, other than Camp Calvin Crest, must be **PRIOR** approved by the Christian Education Committee before camperships will be awarded. A 2 week approval window is requested in order for the Christian Education Committee to meet on the request.

### **GSPC ADULT CAMBERSHIPS:**

These Camperships were initiated by the Christian Education Committee in 2016 (initial amount of \$1,000.00) through Foundation Specific Giving Funds. Every effort will be made to promote donations to this fund on a yearly basis. Funds will be available as long as donations continue to support this cause.

Adult Camperships are available for 35% of the event/retreat up to a maximum of \$125.00 per person per year.\*\* The event must be Christian based and promote the spiritual growth of the person attending. In order to receive a campership a “GSPC Application for Campership Request Form” must be filled out **PRIOR** to registering and approval from the Christian Education

Committee must be given. A 2 week approval window is requested in order for the Christian Education Committee to meet on a request.

In the event a campership is paid out and a participant is unable to attend the sponsored camp/event, the participant is required to reimburse GSPC for the cost of the campership awarded barring extenuating circumstances communicated in writing to the Pastor of GSPC.

NOTE: Members of the Christian Education Committee who apply for a campership or whose children are applying for a campership that must be approved by the CE Committee will excuse themselves during the voting portion of the selection process.

### **GSPC CAMPERSHIPS ARE AVAILABLE AS FOLLOWS:**

- The campership fund is intended for our active church attendees and their families.
- The camp must be a faith based camp (for youth, Camp Calvin Crest is the preferred camp but others may qualify but first must be prior approved by the CE Committee).
- Each youth/adult who is approved for a campership will receive 35% of their camp registration fee, not to exceed \$125.00 per person per calendar year.

### **THE THREE STEPS TO RECEIVE YOUR CAMPERSHIP TO CAMPS OTHER THAN CALVIN CREST:**

1. Individual must fill out a “GSPC APPLICATION FOR CAMPERSHIP REQUEST FORM” and attach a copy of the registration to the camp of their choice. If attending Camp Calvin Crest this requirement is waived.
2. Turn the “GSPC APPLICATION FOR CAMPERSHIP REQUEST FORM” in to the CE Chair to be reviewed/approved by this committee (per session approval in June 2016).
3. Individuals must send in their own deposit money to the camps by their stated deadline. Individuals, not camps, (except for Camp Calvin Crest) will be reimbursed for the 35%, not to exceed \$125.00, for their camp fee. If attending Camp Calvin Crest this is done automatically by the business office at Camp Calvin Crest and the money will be paid directly to Camp Calvin Crest.

There are currently two (2) campership accounts (one for youth and one for adults). It is the responsibility of the CE Committee to make an effort each year to raise money to keep these accounts healthy. The second Sunday in February has been designated as “Youth Campership Sunday” to raise money for the “Youth Campership” fun.

**\*\*NOTE: if the campership awarded is less than \$125.00, your scholarship will be used up. The scholarship is a one-time per year gift and no balance will be carried forward for other camps in that calendar year.**

## **GSPC Youth Mission Trip Policy**

As soon as all expenses are estimated, the cost of the mission trip will be relayed to parents of youth in the Good Shepherd Presbyterian Youth group. The date for payment information will be no later than the second Sunday in January,

On the second Sunday in January following worship there will be a parents meeting going over the overall cost of the mission trip including the expenses and any financial help that may occur from either the mission fund or additional fundraising the youth are involved in.

Funds from the youth mission account will only be provided to those who are active participants at Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church youth group and/or are an active participant in the youth fundraiser. A minimum of 2 fundraising opportunities will be offered each year.

The first payment (deposit), for the mission trip ensures a spot on the mission trip for a youth. Paying the deposit (\$50) and submitting the appropriate paper work no later than the first week in February, **parents are promising to pay for their child's(ren's) remaining balance in full. The deposit is nonrefundable.**

After the initial deposit deadline, there will be two additional deadlines for payment that must be met. These dates include the first week in March and the first week in April. Payments will vary per child depending on the level of fundraising activity the child was involved in. If payments are not submitted in the appropriate time, a \$20 late fee will be charged for every additional month unpaid.

In addition, both parents and youth must attend the mandatory youth mission trip meeting on the second Sunday of June which will be held in the parlor of Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church following worship.

If the cost of the mission trip cannot be met, and additional help is needed, please contact the Youth Director at Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church prior to the March deadline. The Youth Director will bring the matter to the CE Committee for consideration.

**The goal of Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church is to allow all youth to attend a meaningful spiritual environment in the setting of a mission trip.**
