GREETINGS FROM PASTOR JEFF!

As we roll into September, I will sure miss Tad's presence around the office. We said goodbye to Tad as our Director of Youth Ministries in worship August 17 and his last day was the 24th. Carole already mentioned how quiet it was Monday! One thing I will greatly miss about Tad being here is Tad's Christ-centered focus in life. There was never any doubt in my mind as to who was Tad's Lord and who he put first in life. We do wish Tad well in his new job and all his endeavors in life, may the Lord richly bless him.

On another note, every time I turn on the news lately it seems like one thing is front and center, racial tension. It has been on full display in parts of the country and in the news nearly non-stop for weeks. As I watch images of violence, how I wish they would keep the words of our Lord Jesus Christ, recorded by Luke, in mind and close to the heart. **Luke 6:27-36** *"But I say to you who hear: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, "bless those who curse you, and pray for those who spitefully use you. "To him who strikes you on the one cheek, offer the other also. And from him who takes away your cloak, do not withhold your tunic either. "Give to everyone who asks of you. And from him who takes away your goods do not ask them back. "And just as you want men to do to you, you also do to them likewise. "But if you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners love those who love them. "And if you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners do the same. "And if you lend to those from whom you hope to receive back, what credit is that to you? For even sinners lend to sinners to receive as much back. "But love your enemies, do good, and lend, hoping for nothing in return; and your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High. For He is kind to the unthankful and evil. "Therefore be merciful, just as your Father also is merciful."*

They are words that are not all that popular today (as many want to use violent tactics against those with whom they disagree), but then again these words of Jesus were not all that popular 2,000 years ago. This is the kind of talk that got Jesus hung on a cross, as it runs completely counter to the world's convictions. But as the Lord declares, *"My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways My ways, for as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are My ways higher than your ways, and My thoughts than your thoughts."* **Isaiah 55:8-9.**

The wisdom of God is indeed higher than human wisdom and the ways of God higher than human ways and the way to change hearts and minds is through God's ways, blessing those who curse you and showing love to enemies. True, there are times when we as a people must rely on our armed forces to defend liberty and we are glad for their dedication and sacrifice when that is called for, but in the course of our lives in the civic arena, people should take it from Jesus, and try smothering enemies with love and good deeds. It is more powerful at changing attitudes and defeating the evil of racism than the sword.

Looking back on August, the mission trip to serve *The Great Passion Play* in Eureka Springs, Arkansas was a super experience. We had a great turn out at the Lunch and Learn event following worship on August 27th where the team presented an overview of the trip. I love a mission trip where the host(s) put us to work with meaning work, and that was the case in Eureka Springs. They had jobs for people of all ages and we were getting so much done that they cancelled one of our free time slots to take advantage of having our group there. We did some major landscaping, organized set materials, assisted with installing a new special effect for the play, helped in the kitchen, painted, and many GSPC folks took part in The Great Passion Play. I do want to go there again someday.

I have been hoping to get a lunch bunch Bible study rolling and enough interest has been shown that it is a go! Right now, Tuesday has the most votes, edging Thursday out by a single vote. I will leave the sign up out for another week or two, and then select the final day of the week and get announcements out for the start. This study will be a, through the Bible one book at a time study, starting with Genesis. We will look to alternate Old Testament & New Testament books as we go. Though we will certainly spend a bit of time in Genesis. Bring a lunch if you like and enjoy the Word of God and fellowship. If you are planning to attend and have a study Bible, that would be great, as I will ask those attending to share notes they find interesting with the group.

Confirmation Class Kick-off

Confirmation class begins September 10th! If you know of a 6th-9th grader who has not been through confirmation and is interested in exploring their faith more deeply, please let Pastor Jeff know and have them plan to attend the confirmation classes held 9-10 a.m. at the church on Sunday mornings.

In the church, at baptism, parents promise the Lord that they will raise their children as followers of Jesus teaching their children about the Christian faith. Confirmation is the natural progression of that promise. Children are nurtured and educated in their faith. Hopefully, they wish to make their personal profession of faith in Jesus Christ at the conclusion of the confirmation course. Confirmation is a time for students to sincerely examine their faith, to learn what it means to be a member of the Church (both the Body of Christ and Good Shepherd) and to confirm or reaffirm their baptism and faith publicly. All 6th – 9th graders with a desire to grow in their faith are invited to participate.

TAD'S TIDBITS.....

Proverbs 14:13 "Even in laughter the heart may ache, and joy may end in grief."

There comes a time in every Christian's life where life gets tough and more often than not, we don't know why. Sometimes it is because we are being tested, sometimes its God trying to get our attention, and sometimes it's because of who we are. What I mean by that is that we are relational people. In Genesis 1:26 it says "let us make man in our own image". I believe that part of what God is saying here, is let us make man to have relationships. When God created us, he wanted to have a relationship with us, he also wanted us to have relationships with others and throughout the Bible we see this theme pop up all the time. For example, when the Pharisees asked Jesus what the greatest commandment was, he said "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself."

Being relational people, when a relationship is torn whether it's a romantic, friendship, mentorship or any other relationship, we become hurt and full of sorrow. Even though everything else may be going well we are reminded of our broken relationships. This is a glimpse at how God feels when we turn away from him. What is amazing is that God Loved us so much, that he gave his only son, Jesus, as a sacrifice to die on the cross so that our sins could be forgiven, and our relationship with him could be restored. The relationship that we have with God will never fail. God is perfect.

Today as I write this article, I have sorrow. As many of you know I have decided to step down from the position as Director of Student Ministries here at Good Shepherd. There are many reasons I am full of sorrow, but the biggest reason I am sad is because I have met so many wonderful people here at Good Shepherd. This church has become a family to me, and unfortunately, I will need to step away from the church for a period of time.

A youth director is like a shepherd leading a flock. The sheep know the shepherd's voice, and will respond to the shepherd. If you try to introduce the flock to a new shepherd with the old shepherd around, who will the sheep listen to? As the new youth director takes over, I find it in the best interest of the flock that I take some time away to allow the new shepherd to take over.

There are many things I am going to miss about this church. Cookie Sundays, the men's Bible study, the youth, and most importantly the people of GSPC as a whole. When I started volunteering for the youth many of you welcomed me with open arms including Pastor Jeff. I still remember talking to him one day and I said "Jeff, the day you preach on gluttony is the day I join the church". Coincidentally that day I started membership classes Jeff had talked about gluttony that Sunday morning.

I have many memories I wish I could share, however I know Carole only has a limited spot for my article, so I will try to keep it short. But if anyone would ever like to talk or hear more stories, I am always willing to talk. As I go forward into a new job I will let the Joy of the Lord be my strength for His Joy and His Love is perfect. I would encourage you to do the same.

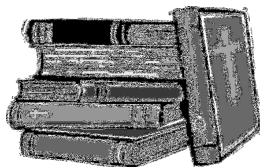

The DVD addition is "The Great Muppet Caper".

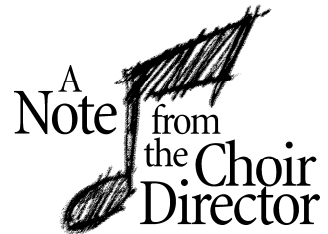
The books from the reading list for 2017 – 2018 will be introduced at the GSPC Presbyterian Women Fall Luncheon on September 6th.

The Congregational Outreach Team is working on a new pictorial directory for the church! The Session approved the following motions at the August 15th, 2017 Meeting:

- To hire two paid positions (one for Wave and one for Ripple) to be 3 hours per week each to be paid \$15.00 per hour, if unable to find volunteers.
- To schedule Vacation Bible School to be held June 11-15th in 2018.
- To have the Infant and Toddler Rooms carpets of the church cleaned.
- To replace two Air Conditioners (both leaking Freon) at \$1,800 each to be funded by the Foundation.
- To accept the \$1,100 anonymous gift to replace the church's commercial vacuum.
- To allow the Worship Team to begin advertising in the Lincoln Journal Star newspaper for holiday services.
- To remove extraneous items from Sanctuary near the piano.
- To authorize special offering/s during worship to solicit funds for the Deacons.
- To change the Youth Director's Job Description by removing any description of work and/or hours connected to helping in the Daycare.
- To allow the Personnel Team to form a search team, to advertise and search for a full time Youth Director at \$30,000 /year.
- To accept Connie Hilligoss as Session Rep to the Nominating Committee.
